What's happening at the ranch...

Spring has sprung here at 8700'! Somedays it is hard to remember it is Spring....when the temperature is 25 F and there is snow on the ground! But other days it is beautiful, with blue skies and the grass turning green! We are almost done calving, which means we can sleep the entire night without alarms to check the girls! We had our FIRST AI calves with first calf heifers, and they did great! Beautiful babies, and they were great mamas. The count right now is in favor of bull calves (the boys)....I'm hoping the heifers (girls) catch up!


Did you know a cow is pregnant "about" 283 days...around 9 months. The pregnancy length can be 279-292 days, and like human babies, they come when they are ready! The babies are born (ideally) head first with their head on their front legs...and they are on their feet within 30 minutes generally. They are spunky from the get-go, and their mamas start cleaning them up as soon as they hit the ground. This miracle of life never gets old, and it make us appreciate that we are lucky enough to witness their first breath.

We also bought a new herd sire this year! We made the change to a polled Hereford (no horns) so 2026 babies will be black with white faces! Why did we change it up? Our last bull (Ram116 – AKA William Wallace) was amazing...great genetics and great temperament- but we are keeping his daughters and wanted to bring some new genetics in! We opted for a Hereford, as the Black Angus and Hereford cross offers exceptional maternal characteristics (good mamas) and great bee production! We buy our bulls from the Colorado State University Seedstock team, where these animals have their genetic potential mapped out, are well cared for, and are tested to ensure fertility! Plus, we believe in supporting CSU's efforts in training the next generation of beef production experts!
